

As March brought snow and some of the coldest temperatures of this year, I will be glad when the schizophrenic weather patterns give way to predictable late spring and early summer patterns of hot and hotter. Pastors and church treasurers don't like snow on Sunday. The tithes and offerings often stay away with the people that don't come. It has a ripple effect because when church funds are down, ministry can be hindered. When church funds are down, often Cooperative Program funds are down and Associational giving from the churches. This too can affect ministry.

Now, here are some positive things. The NAMB sponsored a Collegiate Student Blitz during March. It was in the Johnsonville/Lake City and Hemmingway area serving in several counties. Over three weeks, we had over 350 college students from as far away as Penn State University, working on houses affected by the 2015 flood and/or Hurricane Matthew. We have had some of our Hebron Feeding Unit members, and other volunteers, helping in the feeding of these workers. Also others have helped to clean our shower units from Evergreen and South Florence. This will be the last large event to be hosted using the First Johnsonville and First Hemmingway churches. We continue to be thankful for the 18 + months that First Johnsonville has allowed Disaster Relief and SC Rebuild to occupy their facility. We are also thankful to First Hemmingway, for allowing their facilities to be

used several times for these large events.

As the SC Rebuild efforts will be coming to a conclusion at the Johnsonville site, future options are being explored especially in Marion County. Locally, we had a large turnout for Disaster Relief Training in Florence. Calvary hosted the training and the numbers being trained were the largest in many years. Also there were nearly half being trained for the first time. The end result of all Disaster Relief and Rebuild ministry is to bring people to Christ, and strengthen the church. We have seen these results in the lower part of Florence County and beyond. We have had chaplains and a church planter at work in the area and we have seen baptisms and a bible study started.

I will begin a study in April, with some pastors and staff, on revitalizing dying churches. One of the symptoms of a dying church is the lack of baptisms. 32% of our reporting FBA churches have reported zero baptisms in at least two of the last five years. 63% of our churches are trending downward in the number of baptisms over the last five years. These are disturbing trends that we must all not just be concerned over, but we should be actively praying and reaching out to the lost with the Gospel. April is a good month to reach out telling people of your Risen Savior! He Is Risen!
