We continue to hear all the reports about the majority of our Southern Baptist Churches being plateaued or declining. What is your reaction to these reports? Here are some of the things I hear: "people just don't go to church like they used to", "I don't know why people won't come to church", "we have tried and tried to get people to come", and others. Many of our churches have suffered through drops in attendance. Often we continue to experience lack of growth for several reasons.

One such reason is our expectations. We somehow expect lost people to have interest in church. Then, if we do get lost people to come, we expect them to behave like "church people". As a rule, I don't go to car shows. I don't have anything against car shows. I am happy that people that like car shows are able to go to car shows. You see I don't much care to walk around and look at cars. For people to be interested in car shows, they need to be in love with cars.

People that are interested in church need to be in love with Jesus. Church can be many things. It is the Body of Christ, the Bride of Christ, a local body of Jesus followers. It can also be perceived as an institution, a country club, a cult, and many other things. We aren't going to get people to the car shows until they fall in love with cars, and we aren't going to get them to be a part of the local body of believers until they fall in love with Jesus. While a car enthusiast would have a hard time trying to get me to go to a car show, a

Jesus follower is dependent of the Spirit of God to draw people to Jesus.

I have been leading a group of pastors through Mark Clifton's book "Reclaiming Glory, Revitalizing Dying Churches". In the success stories of churches that have been able to be revitalized there are some common characteristics. Prayer is the one that is more important than any. Prayer will lead a person that is not engaged in reaching the community to become engaged. Prayer can cause a church that has not previously heard from God concerning how to reach the community, to hear from God concerning reaching the community. Who do we ask to do what we can't do, someone that can do it.

You may have tried and failed. Your congregation might be tired and not very energetic, but remember to ask God to do something that you can't do and ask Him for the energy to do it through you. In one story, a pastor and one member, who showed up to pray, were the beginning of a move of God that revitalized a congregation. Would you be that member that will pray and be led by the Spirit of God to start what will be revitalization?

North Carolina Baptist Disaster Relief responded to us after the great flood of October 2015. NC Baptist men then took the lead in Rebuild SC until Hurricane Matthew forced them back into service in their own state.
