Director of Missions Report

The year 2012 has marked a period of transition for the Florence Baptist Association. Beginning the last day of February the Lord began to work in the hearts of myself and the Personnel/Search Committee to confirm what He intended for the FBA. I began ministry as Director of Missions on June 18th of 2012; this was also the first day of 2012 LifeChangers.

Once again I want to thank the Search Committee in their diligence in the search. They were praying and asking God to work in and through the process. There were times in the process that their prayers were truly felt and were a stabilizing force in our understanding of God's will in the process. Rev. Stan Sullivan is also to be commended as he served as Interim Director of Missions. He not only was a stabilizing force but continued to lead as the new missions partnerships were not put on hold but were encouraged to press forward. We are grateful for his service as interim and as he has helped me in beginning the transition. LifeChangers, which was celebrating the ten year anniversary this year, was once again a great ministry. This was another year of setting records as the event has continued to grow. LifeChangers is a wonderful local expression of God's love through the churches of the FBA. We plan and pray for it to continue to grow and share the Love of Christ in Florence County.

In the months prior to the vision trip that occurred in August, the Mission Partnership Taskforce was seeking God's will concerning mission partnerships. After some conversations with Martin Jones (Summit Baptist Association) and Derrick Jones (Atlantic Canada) those on the Missions Partnership Taskforce felt God leading to visit these areas. Rev. J.D. Weed (Union), Rev. Stan Sullivan (Sparrow Swamp), and I went to the Summit Baptist Association in Akron, Ohio and New Brunswick, Canada. While in Ohio we met with Martin Jones and some pastors and church planters. God is at work and they need help and encouragement. There are a variety of needs which makes for a great opportunity for the churches of the FBA to respond. The situation is Canada is different in that the areas of population are rather spread out. After meeting with church planters there, we felt a starting point would be with two church planters in two different cities Dieppe and Miramichi. If the FBA votes to enter into these partnerships we expect to begin trips as early as the spring of 2013.

We have a group of ministers now studying the "Truth Project". The "Truth Project" is a study centered on, understanding and living out life in the context of, a Biblical world view. Currently I am leading this group of six ministers through this study produced by "Focus on the Family". There has already been discussion concerning how to use this study in the churches where they minister and out in the community. We hope to have other groups meet as word spreads about the effectiveness of this study!

On a personal note, I want to again thank the churches of the FBA for the warm reception that you have given our family. We are so blessed to be a part of you. We are continuing to enjoy visiting in the churches and the ministry events we have been involved in. We look forward to great days ahead as we minister together!

Mission and Ministries Development Director

In December 2011 our association prepared 1050 prisoner packets. Many of our churches participated in the Operation Christmas Child shoebox ministry. FBA churches prepared 368 ministry health kits in April 2012. In August 2012 our churches collected 516 "Back to School" packets for the students at Francis Marion. We also collected 35 book bags and \$240 for book bags to be taken to Akron Ohio on the vision trip.

We had 2 summer missionaries appointed by NAMB: Kat Bonvillain from Lake Charles, Louisiana and Jessica Rodgers from Pascagoula, Mississippi. They did 5K – 5th grade Kid's Klubs at the YMCA and Bee Helpful Day Care. They worked with 188 children with 8 children accepting Christ during the summer. They worked with the girls from the Pee Dee Campus of the Connie Maxwell Children's Home. They also worked with A Choice 2 M8K Crisis Pregnancy Center on Tuesdays. They organized the baby boutique, counted money from the baby bottle campaign, painted wicker furniture, etc. They also worked with Camp RAE, a camp for special needs children, on Fridays during July. Kat and Jessica were able to share their testimonies with children, youth and adults in twelve of our churches.

We had a fantastic week at LifeChangers, June 17-22, 2012. Calvary Baptist graciously hosted us again for our 10th year. There were 150 youth and adult participants from 10 different churches involved in the week of work. We had 10 crews that worked on 12 homes in the City of Florence. We had one roof job and numerous paint jobs with most involving replacing rotten wood. Rev. J. D. Weed, Pastor of Union, was our camp pastor and the Lord used him in the lives of the youth in a mighty way. Rev. Landon Reynolds and the praise band from Calvary lead the worship music. Lunches and the evening meals were prepared by FBA churches. We had a 10 year birthday party on Thursday night celebrating with cake and ice cream and powerpoint presentation of the past 10 years. Mark your calendars now for our **LifeChangers 2013 – June 16-21!!!**

Our Fair Ministry expanded again this year and boy was it FUN! We served a chicken bog meal for the fair workers on set up day, Oct. 2 from 5:30 - 7 pm and distributed the ministry health kits. On Friday, Oct. 5 we had a FREE Yard sale from 10 until noon. We collected "practical items" like toilet paper, paper towels, blankets, toiletries, medicine, books, etc. Each person was given 10 tickets to spend at the sale. On Sunday, October 7 we had a FREE breakfast provided by Southside Baptist and worship at 10:30 am lead by the Freedom Riders. On October 8-9 we did FREE blood pressure checks, haircuts and coffee & doughnuts from 10 am – 12 pm. We also had children's ministry both of those days. On Tuesday, Oct. 11, we offered free skin care by Mary Kay Consultants, free fingernail painting and free photographs of the workers. We let them order what size prints they wanted and then printed them as a gift to them. On Sunday, October 14 we gave out 150 Snack Sacks to the workers as they were breaking down all the rides. A HUGE thanks to Kelly Hyman for all her hard work in leading this ministry and for all of the volunteers who contributed in so many ways.

The Christian Learning Center of Florence County had a great 8th year. There were three classes at Southside, Sneed, and Hannah Pamplico and two classes at Williams. There were over 60 salvations reported. Praise the Lord! This ministry has the potential to grow so pray for the board to have wisdom to expand this ministry the way God sees fit. There will be a chicken bog benefit on Thursday, December 6th. Watch for more details. We also need monthly gifts from individuals, businesses, and churches. Please keep this ministry in your prayers.

God is blessing the ministry of CEF through the Good News Clubs. God added 4 new clubs last year that brings us to thirteen Good News Clubs in our chapter. In the thirteen clubs we had 1,134 children enrolled with 217 professions of faith. Praise the Lord! We have one new club that just started at Thornwell Elementary in Hartsville (sponsored by Hartsville

Presbyterian). We have a club at Moore Intermediate but we don't have a church to sponsor it. Please make this a matter of prayer – the teachers at Moore pay for their own material and do all the teaching – they need help!! The new elementary school – Lucy Davis – is being sponsored by Pisgah United Methodist but they need more volunteers. Lester has a sponsor church now but they need more volunteers before they can start. We need more churches to get involved in this ministry to help financially support CEF or to sponsor a club. WE NEED YOUR HELP!!! Our region contains 5 counties with 53 elementary schools and our goal is - to have a GNC in every school. Please keep this ministry in your prayers.

Family Promise is a ministry to homeless children and their families. This ministry will enlist at least 13 churches to serve as host churches to host not more that 14 guests for one week at a time. This is going to need the involvement of the entire community to make this to work. Family Promise of Florence has completed all the paperwork and been approved for 501c3 status. We have eight sponsor churches at this time, but we need 5 more before we can begin. This is a GREAT hands-on ministry for churches and individuals. We need VOLUNTEERS!! Please be praying for this ministry as it is in the beginning stages of development in our area. Pray about your churches' part.

I continue to serve on the Administrative Board for CLC, the Local Committee for the Greater Florence Chapter of CEF, the Advisory Board for the Chrysalis Center, Florence School District One Faith Based Group, the Mayor's Coalition and Family Promise Board of Directors.

It is my honor and privilege to serve God as your missionary. I LOVE it! To God be the glory, great things HE hath done!

Baptist Collegiate Ministry Report

God has been doing incredible things in the lives of college students at Francis Marion University and Florence Darlington Technical College during this past school year. BCM was part of seeing 12 college students come to faith in Christ during the 2011-2012 school year and we have already seen 1 student accept Christ this semester.

We have several students who recently returned from serving as summer missionaries through the International Mission Board and the North American Mission Board. This summer students served in Swaziland, Philippians, India, Greece, Canada, Ohio, Maryland, Alaska, and around South Carolina. BCM students raise \$5500 to help fellow students reach the mission field. BCM also did some short term mission projects at Christmas time in the Upstate of SC and was a part of a larger team that served in the Cleveland, Ohio area with other BCM groups from around SC.

During the school year, BCM holds weekly worship gatherings called '153.' This is the largest gathering of college students in the Pee Dee area on a regular basis. Each night starts with a meal that local churches volunteer to bring and then students lead in worship and testimony. Often times, I will bring the message or another pastor/youth minister in our area. We normally run about 120 student on average at these events.

BCM has also launched brand new small groups called Core Groups. Each group is lead by an upperclassmen and they serve as a means to disciple students. We have seen a lot of spiritual and numerical growth in our groups over the last year. Each week we write material for the groups to use that fits with the series of sermons we preach on Tuesday nights.

Thank you so much for your support of Baptist Collegiate Ministry. This ministry would not be possible without the backing of our churches and our association. Thank you for allowing me to invest my life in college students.

Through the Foundation's services, individuals have an opportunity to use their blessings to *bring good news*! The Foundation promotes Christian stewardship in life and death by providing education and services to promote wise estate and financial planning principles so that resources can be given to support the ministry causes that each individual chooses. We promote endowment gifts to provide for ministry both today *and* tomorrow so that those who come after us will have the opportunity to know Christ.

The Foundation also provides services to promote the growth and financial health of churches and ministries. We offer low cost and competitive investment services for SC Baptist churches, associations, and ministries so that their ministries can grow. We also provide campaign stewardship services to assist churches to raise funds for capital and other needs. God continues to bless this ministry and has used this ministry throughout its history to provide much needed resources for Baptist causes throughout our state and world. Since the first endowment of \$16 was received in 1950, the Foundation has distributed almost \$56 million to primarily Southern Baptist ministries. Distributions to ministries continue to increase each year as God provides resources through the benevolence of South Carolina Baptists. Major accomplishments during the 2011/2012 fiscal year are highlighted below:

□□Distributed \$2,182,381 to primarily South Carolina Baptist charitable beneficiaries.
□□Distributed an additional \$944,358 to individual living trust beneficiaries from trust and annuity accounts, most of which will eventually become endowments.
□□Awarded 15 grants totaling \$48,295 for Kingdom growth projects across our state.
□□Awarded \$14,800 in scholarships to 27 students, with the majority of those funds going to students preparing for full-time Christian service.
□□Maintained our operating budget with less Cooperative Program funding for the year 2012. Since our inception, the Foundation has returned over \$6.00 to primarily Baptist causes for every \$1 allocated to our ministry through the Cooperative Program.
□□Continued the Foundation Ambassador Program of statewide volunteers who are the "eyes and ears" for the Foundation in their churches and communities.
□□Received a clean annual audit with no reportable conditions and maintained membership and good standing with the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability (ECFA).

The Foundation's goals are to increase our presence in churches and associations, to educate Baptists about the importance of Christian estate planning, to provide additional online services to assist individuals in developing their estate plans, to increase endowment giving for all SC Baptist ministry causes, to increase funding sources for grant programs and scholarships, and to enhance our investment services for SC Baptist ministries.

The Foundation's ministry is far-reaching. We touch churches in all South Carolina counties as well as missionaries serving around the globe. Our vision is "to see all (the giver and the receiver) experience Christian generosity." Our goal is to educate and equip believers to be the "beautiful feet" that *bring good news* to the world!

Ministry Report of North Greenville University

At North Greenville University we continue to have record enrollments, build new facilities, maintain a lower cost of tuition, room, and board as compared to most universities and colleges, provide more scholarships, receive adequate gifts, hire new staff and faculty, give raises, cover the cost of health and retirement benefits, begin new academic and athletic programs, improve the growth of our endowment, and operate within the budget. Without a doubt, we are in the excelling mode.

We have just dedicated the Craft/Hemphill World Evangelism, Missions, and Christian Worldview Center and the Todd Prayer Chapel. In these facilities, we have the offices of Dr. Allen McWhite who directs our Global Missions program, Dr. Tony Beam who leads our Christian Worldview perspectives, and Dr. Ken Hemphill, our founding Director of the Church Planting and Revitalization initiatives. The good Lord continues to make a tremendous difference through these men and programs.

Since June 1, 2012 approximately 150 people have received Christ on the North Greenville University campus. Since 1991 we have continued to say that we always want one more saved.

This summer we had our highest enrollment for eight weeks of Centrifuge/M-Fuge combination camps on our campus. North Greenville hosts more campers than any site with the exception of Ridgecrest Conference Center. The M-Fuge campers also impact the greater Greenville community through their ministry and service projects. These camps continue our

institutional mission based on the Great Commission of our Lord to reach others for Christ and encourage believers to grow in their faith pilgrimages.

Our students circled the globe over the summer of 2012 to engage in mission work through a variety of programs and platforms. In our Summer Missions Commissioning Chapel, we celebrated the fact that nearly 300 students, faculty, and staff participated in ministries that touched lives through both individual and group projects and partnerships. Additionally, almost 100 students served on summer camps staffs.

We have a great story to tell at North Greenville University and it is our intention that we will continue to grow and accomplish our mission of preparing Christ-centered leaders

Connie Maxwell Children's Home 2012

Dr. J.C. Maxwell and his wife Sarah offered their 470-acre farm, their home, and a sizeable amount of money for South Carolina Baptists to operate this children's ministry. The Maxwell's recently had lost their only surviving daughter, 7-year old Connie, to scarlet fever and were looking for a way to remember their little girl. The only stipulations to their gifts were that the ministry be placed in their hometown of Greenwood and that it be named for their daughter Connie. Susie Burton of Newberry was admitted as the first child into care on May 22, 1892. The children's home celebrated its 120th anniversary in May of this year. Over the years Connie Maxwell has added satellite campuses across the state. We have also created new ministries such as the Family Care Program. This ministry exists to restore families with hope, comfort, and shelter while they locate the resources they need to move toward successful independent living. Relief and assistance are provided to single-parents from all walks of life so each family can focus on resolving their individual crisis and temporary instability. While the parent works toward setting goals with the guidance of dedicated and supportive staff; he/she lives in a comfortable residential setting with his/her children. We are also emphasizing our Parenting Again Program. We are assisting grandparents who find themselves raising their grandchildren under very difficult circumstances. Connie Maxwell provides a safe, nurturing and Christian environment for children. From young elementary school-age children to seniors graduating from high school, Connie Maxwell partners with grandparents in meeting the basic physical, intellectual, emotional and spiritual needs of these children. The grandchildren can benefit from the ministry of Connie Maxwell and still spend significant time with their grandparents. In our Foster Care Program Phil Russell and Brooke Thompson are working with the Department of Social Services to help prepare families to receive children of all ages into their homes. Many South Carolina Baptist Churches are partnering with us to make this possible.

Connie Maxwell is considered a "low maintenance" facility. Children must be willing to accept help for their needs. Connie Maxwell does not deny admittance because of race, religion, ethnicity or creed but does advise all those who make application that Christian values are taught and expected. The residential ministry in Greenwood has 72 school-age children in daily care while Cooper Nixon Shelter Care on the campus provides for the needs of eight children coming from emergency situations. The Adams Campus in Chesterfield County serves as an emergency shelter also and houses eight children. The Marie Younts Home in Mauldin has six resident teenage girls, and the Pee Dee Campus in Florence cares for eight teenage girls. Sixteen boys and girls live at our Brookland Campus in Orangeburg. The Lowcountry Regional Office in Summerville provides counseling, training sessions and referral services to families in that area. As our students graduate from high school, Connie Maxwell helps to provide the opportunity to attend college. In 2012, four students under our care are pursuing higher education degrees. Our children attend Baptist churches in their communities or Connie Maxwell Baptist Church in Greenwood. Also, because of your generosity, children from our ministry enjoy summer camps at Camp McCall, Camp La Vida and Centrifuge.

Each of Connie Maxwell's locations benefits on a daily basis from the support of caring individuals and Baptist churches. About 10% of our operating income is provided through the

Cooperative Program. Despite a widely held belief, Connie Maxwell does not receive any of the funds from the Janie Chapman Statewide Missions Offering. Direct church gifts provide 10 %. Therefore, over three-fourths of the operating income is given by individuals, businesses and interest generated from estate gifts. Many South Carolina Baptists give to Connie Maxwell in memory or in honor of a loved one or someone who has impacted their lives. Connie Maxwell is very much dependent on this generosity to help meet the needs of children who have experienced devastating events in their lives. During these difficult economic times, many positions that have opened because of attrition have been assumed by existing staff instead of hiring new employees. Volunteer groups visit the various campuses and provide a variety of ministries, and the food center on the main campus receives donations of groceries to help provide meals for the children.

Come accept our appreciation by enjoying "A Connie Maxwell Christmas" in Greenwood December 6, 7 and 8, 2012. The nights will be filled with lights of the holiday, and music will also fill the air and children of all ages will have the opportunity to ride in horse-drawn wagons and visit Bethlehem at our live Nativity. Again, thanks for all you do for our children.

South Carolina Baptist Ministries for the Aging, Inc.

As a Ministry Partner, the Ministry for the Aging has the privilege of serving those who spent their lives serving others. In 1 Corinthians 4:1-2, the apostle Paul tells believers that we "ought to regard ourselves as servants of Christ .. it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful". Through the generous support of South Carolina Baptists, Martha Franks and Bethea Baptist Retirement Communities serve retired pastors, pastor's wives, missionaries and Christian laypeople – the men and women who faithfully paved the way as colaborers to impact the world for Christ.

While SCBMA's priority is providing high quality care and services to senior adults, we strive to be witnesses of Jesus Christ; continuing to be a place where ministry and missions work is the core of our activities.

As with so many ministries, the Ministry for the Aging has experienced significant financial challenges in 2012 due to governmental funding reductions. Even with this ministry impact, we give thanks for the number of senior adults we are blessed to serve as well as the 7.5% of this ministry's budget provided for through the Cooperative Program.

Through God's continued blessings on the ministry, SCBMA's leadership team and Board of Trustees are prayerfully considering how to better serve our current resident population at Martha Franks and Bethea as well as the ever growing number of senior adults in South Carolina with retirement needs.

In the upcoming year, the ministry's operational focus will include:

Debt service reduction.

Conversion of Independent Living Apartments to provide a licensed Assisted Living service at Bethea.

Development of "Ministry Friends" supporters to assist with strategic plans. Continuance of capital improvement projects at both Bethea and Martha Franks. Execution of the Ministry's Strategic Plan.

While the ministry embarks on these future plans, our mission continues to give concrete evidence of concern for and commitment to an aging population.

The service was closed with a time of response and directed prayer for our association and the new ministries within our association.

One Hundred Twenty Third Annual Session Florence Baptist Association October 25, 2012

Rev. Bob Dockery, Moderator, welcomed the messengers and visitors to the Business Portion of the One Hundred Twenty Third Annual Session. Rev. Dockery made a motion that we accept the Book of Reports as the Order of Business. After a second the motion carried.

Rev. David George, pastor Cartersville Baptist Church led the messengers and visitors in a devotion and prayer.

Executive Committee Report – Presented by Rev. Bob Dockery. Rev. Dockery reviewed the 2012 Executive Committee Summary. This was presented as information only.

Treasurer's Report – Presented by Rev. Gerald McCants. Rev. McCants reviewed the September 2012 Treasurer's Report.

Stewardship Committee Report - Presented by Rev. David George. Rev. George reviewed the proposed 2013 budget. Rev. George made a recommendation that we accept the proposed 2013 Budget. As this recommendation came from the Stewardship Committee a second was not required. The 2013 Budget was approved.

Nominating Committee Report – presented by Mr. George Ihrie. Mr. Ihrie reviewed the 2012-2013 Nominating Committee Report. Mr. Ihrie noted that David Wike will be replacing Justin McAlpin on the BCM Committee. He also noted that we still have two positions open, Sunday School Director and Discipleship and Family Director. Mr. Ihrie made a recommendation that we accept the proposed Nominating Committee Report. As this recommendation came from the Nominating Committee a second was not required. The 2012-2013 Nominating Committee Report was approved with changes.

Resolutions Committee Recommendations – presented by Mr. Don Trask. Mr. Trask reviewed the following resolutions.

Resolution No. 1

BE IT RESOLVED that the Florence Baptist Association gratefully thanks South Florence Baptist Church, it's Pastor and Member Body for the privilege extended in hosting the Associational Inspirational Meeting, October 14, 2012.

As this motion came from the Resolutions Committee a second was not required. Motion carried

Time, Place and Preacher Recommendations - presented by Rev. Chris Smith

We recommend that the Annual Inspirational meeting be held on October 13th 2013. In keeping with moving this meeting among the church groupings, we further recommend that it be held at

Hoffmeyer Road Baptist Church. We will enlist the Mission Partnership Taskforce to make the decision on a preacher, at a later date, from one of the Mission Partnerships. As this came from a committee a second was not required. Motion carried.

The new pastors and staff of the Florence Baptist Association were recognized.

Christian Learning Center Report – Presented by Rev. Stan Sullivan. Rev. Sullivan reminded everyone of the upcoming CLC Chicken Bog Fund Raiser scheduled for December 6th. The first organizational meeting will be on Tuesday, Nov. 6th at the FBA Office. Rev. Sullivan asked for volunteers to help with this fund raiser. We are looking for ways to expand the ministry of the Christian Learning Center. Prayer needs for the ministry are: pray for the students and teachers; pray for Pamplico who has two classes of all boys this semester; pray for the Administrative Board as we seek God's wisdom as to where we need to expand; pray for extra funding; pray for the fund raiser that associational and non-associational churches will take part.

Baptist Collegiate Ministries Report – Presented by Rev. Kendal Danford. Every Tuesday night we have between 100-200 college students meeting on our campus. BCM on our campus is the largest organization on the FMU campus. Of the students about 70 of them are involved in intentional discipleship. We have small groups meeting in the dorms, apartments, BCM Building, The Grill, all over the campus. Students are taking the responsibility of presenting the Gospel. Missions is a big deal at BCM – this past summer we had students in Africa, India, Alaska, Ohio, etc. So far this year, we have nine students except Jesus as their Savior. Kendal thanked everyone for their support of this ministry.

Missions Partnership Report – Presented by Rev. Stan Sullivan. Stan voiced his appreciation for Bob's work with the Romania Partnership for the past ten years. This time last year we were still seeking God's will as to where He wanted us to begin our new ministry with missions. Since that time, we have met with Derek Jones, Church Catalyst Planter from New Brunswick Canada and Mark Jones from Summit Baptist Association. We feel God leading us towards these two areas of ministry. The sky is the limit as to what type ministries that can be done in these areas, especially Ackron Ohio. Two Task Force Teams will be created – J. D. Weed will lead the Canada Task Force and Stan Sullivan will lead the Ohio Task Force.

The Missions Partnership Task Force of the Florence Baptist Association recommends that we enter into a three year partnership with Summit Baptist Association of Akron, Ohio, and the New Brunswick area of Canada, beginning in 2013 and that we have these partnerships finalized by the January Executive Committee Meeting. Ministry and Missions Development Director Report – presented by Mrs. Louanne Stewart. The Good News Club are growing. We now have a church that has adopted Lucy David and Lester. Now we only have Wallace Gregg within District One that needs adopting. We have three clubs in Hartsville with more clubs to start in the near future. College Park has agreed to support the club at Moore. We still need clubs in Timmonsville, Lake City, and Pamplico Middle Schools. The fair was awesome especially in the collection of items. The years sale was huge success. We handed out 150 snack sacks. Family Promise almost has all the host churches needed. We are still working on funding and we are still searching a director. Prisoner Packets are due in the associational office on November 26th. Please check the bags before they are brought to the office, especially the toothpaste and toothbrushes. More information will be provided in the near future regarding Human Trafficking.

Director of Missions Report – presented by Rev. Chris Smith. Rev. Smith thanked everyone for their support in the move to the association. We look forward to what God has in store for our association. I am excited about the ministry possibilities in Canada and Ohio. We are

looking for volunteers to help develop these two partnerships. During the January Executive Committee meeting we hope to announce trips to both locations. The Truth Project is going well with a group of six ministers. I hope to have another group begin after the first of the year. The financial report was good. Giving is up this year in compared to last year. Rev. Smith thanked everyone for their financial support of the association. Rev. Smith asked that we see the importance of the BCM Ministry. Rev. Smith commended Kendal for his leadership within the BCM Ministry and with his work with the students of the ministry. Rev. Smith mentioned that some of the support for the BCM ministry has decreased. We have an opportunity as churches to help with this need – if your church does not support BCM, please consider this need; if your church already supports BCM please consider increasing your gift. Rev. Smith asked that we pray about this need and see how our churches can support this important ministry with our association.

Miscellaneous Business -

The Personnel committee made the following recommendation: The Personnel Committee recommends new office hours for the Florence Baptist Association office beginning January 2, 2013 to the following: Monday-Thursday, 8:30 am to 5:00 pm and Friday, 8:30 am to 1:00 pm. (The existing FBA office hours are Monday-Friday, 8:30 am – 4:30 pm.) As this came from the Personnel Committee a second was not required. The motion carried.

Rev. Eddie Stewart closed the meeting in prayer.

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this body is "The Florence Baptist Association."

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

It is the purpose of the Association to provide an organization of cooperation for the Missionary Baptist Churches affiliated with it and to encourage them to faithfulness in every endeavor which we shall undertake together in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and to encourage them in the support the Cooperative Program of the South Carolina Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP OF ANNUAL SESSION

The association membership shall consist only of duly elected messengers who are members of the affiliated churches. Membership shall be comprised of the following:

- (1) Three messengers from each church and one additional messenger for each fifty members or fraction thereof, up to a maximum of twelve messengers.
- (2) The pastors of the affiliated churches.
- (3) The duly elected officers of the association.
- (4) The members of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE IV: AFFILIATED PROCEDURES

Those Southern Baptist Churches which have petitioned for membership and which by vote of the Association are accounted to be in fellowship with the purpose and undertaking of this body shall comprise the list of affiliated churches. The vote of the association to extend fellowship, or to withdraw fellowship, shall be a two-thirds vote by messengers present and voting.

All churches of like faith and order may be admitted as members into this Association by two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting, provided that the applying churches comply with Article 13 of the By-laws of this Constitution, and make known their desire to become members of the Association at the annual meeting of the Association one year prior to the annual meeting when the Association will take action on their request.

Failure to report annually to the association may raise the question of fellowship.

- 1. The Association shall regard the churches as autonomous bodies in all their internal affairs and exercise no ecclesiastical jurisdiction or claim any legislative or judicial power over them.
- 2. As every church is an autonomous body, amenable as far as authority is concerned to the Great Head of the Church alone, any church shall have full power to terminate its connection with the Association whenever it may see fit. While, however, a church chooses to continue this connection, the Association must have relative right to inquire into its standing whenever it may be necessary to do so, and in case of dissatisfaction to withdraw from it.

ARTICLE V: OFFICERS

The officers of this Association shall be elected at the annual session and shall assume their duties at the close of the session at which they are elected and serve until their successors are elected and assume their duties. Officers shall be: Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Auditor, Sunday School Director, Discipleship Training Director, Men's Ministries Director, Music Director, and Missions Development Council Director. They will be elected with the officers and other workers at the regular annual meeting. The term of Moderator shall be limited to three consecutive years; other officers shall be limited to five consecutive years with the exception of the clerk who may serve an indefinite term.

ARTICLE VI: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall consist of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Sunday School Director, Chairman of Evangelism, Discipleship Training Director, Music Director, Men's Ministries Director, all trustees, and members of the Missions Development Council Committee, all employed Ministers of Education, Ministers of Music, and Associate Pastors, the Associational WMU Director, together with a pastor and layman from each church, and the Director of Missions as an ex-officio member.

The Executive Committee shall act for the Association <u>ad interim</u> in all matters not otherwise provided for and submit a full report of the work of activities to the Association at each annual session of the Association, together with plans and recommendations for the promotion and extension of the work. Any vacancy of whatever nature occurring between sessions of the association may be filled by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VII: TRUSTEES

The Trustees, or their successors in office, shall as provided by law and the action of the Association, hold in trust the title to all property of the Association, and shall represent the Association in all matters of legal responsibility regarding the purchase, improvement, and disposal of Associational property. They shall executive all legal papers relating to the Association as the Association may direct. They shall have no power to buy, sell, mortgage, lease or transfer any property of the Association without a specific vote of the Association authorizing such action; neither shall they have any control over the use of the Associational property except by vote of the Association (Refer to Article 18 of the By-Laws).

ARTICLE VIII: ASSOCIATIONAL MISSIONS DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

The Associational Missions Development Council will consist of a Director; Missions Survey Director; Promotion Director; Representatives from Associational Sunday School, Discipleship Training, Woman's Missionary Union, and Men's Ministries programs; plus Component Program Directors as needed.

The Associational Missions Development Council has five missions' performance tasks. They are to (1) call churches to be on mission; (2) provide resources and services to churches and leaders; (3) train, develop and encourage church and associational workers; (4) provide opportunities for working together in missions, ministry, growth and evangelism; (5) establish and maintain appropriate communications and relationships with the community and the denomination.

ARTICLE IX: ASSOCIATIONAL COUNCIL

The Associational Council shall be composed of the Moderator, Sunday School Director, Discipleship Training Director, Woman's Missionary Union Director, Men's Ministries Director, Music Director, Clerk, Treasurer, Missions Development Council Director, Stewardship Committee Chairman, Vice-Moderator and the Director of Missions.

The Director of Missions will serve as Chairman and the Clerk as Secretary. The council's function is described in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE X: PROCEDURE

The business of the Association will be conducted according to Roberts Rules of Order latest revised edition.

ARTICLE XI: AMENDMENT

This Constitution may be amended at any session of the Association by a two-thirds vote, provided that the proposed amendments have been read to the Association at a previous meeting and referred to the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws for clarification and correlation.

ARTICLE XII: ADOPTION

This Constitution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption, and any regulations in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1: MEETINGS

The sessions of the Association shall be annual. These meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be decided by the Association in its annual session and messengers present at the annual session shall be considered a quorum. Special or called meetings may be held by a majority vote of the Executive Committee of the Association.

ARTICLE 2: OPENING

Meetings of the Association shall be opened with a devotional service and closed with a prayer.

ARTICLE 3: ORDER OF BUSINESS

An order of business shall be adopted at the beginning of each session and shall be changed only by a two-thirds vote.

ARTICLE 4: CHURCH LETTER

Each affiliated church shall ten days prior to the annual session mail to the clerk, on forms furnished by the clerk, a full report of the church work for the year ending September 30.

ARTICLE 5: MODERATOR AND VICE-MODERATOR

The Moderator or Vice-Moderator shall preside at all meetings of the Association. They shall be members of the Executive Committee and, as opportunity may permit, they shall represent the fellowship of the entire Associational fraternal visitors to the churches.

ARTICLE 6: CLERK

The Clerk shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association and shall prepare and cause to be published and distributed, as directed by the Association of the Executive Committee, minutes and statistics of the Association as soon as feasible after adjournment of the annual session. The necessary forms and letters shall be mailed to the clerks of the affiliated churches thirty days prior to the date of each annual session. Copies of the minutes shall be mailed to the officers, affiliated churches, each institution participating in the Cooperative Program, and such other institutions and individuals as the Association or Executive Committee may direct.

ARTICLE 7: TREASURER

The Treasurer shall receive all funds of the Association and disburse them according to order and present a written report of the same to the annual session of the association. Reports shall also be made to the Chairman of the Stewardship Committee and Executive Committee prior to each regularly scheduled meeting of the Executive Committee and such other reports as the Association or Executive Committee may request. The office of Clerk and Treasurer may be held by the same person.

ARTICLE 8: AUDITOR

The Auditor shall examine the financial books and records of the Association and submit a detailed report covering the audit to each annual session and at such time as may be requested by the Executive Committee of the Association.

ARTICLE 9: COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

It shall be the duty of this committee to receive, examine, correlate, and make recommendations to the Executive Committee or the Association on all proposed amendments to the Constitution or By-Laws.

ARTICLE 10: STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The Stewardship Committee shall be elected annually. The Committee shall consist of six members at large plus the department heads, Director of Missions, Treasurer, and Chairman of the Missions Development Council. One of the six members at large shall be designated as chairman. The committee shall operate four sections: (1) Stewardship Education Section; (2) Mission Support Section; (3) Budget Section; (4) Accounting Section. The Chairman shall assign members to appropriate section with a leader designated for each section.

The Committee shall give leadership and supervision to the total stewardship/financial program of the association and assist churches, at their request with their stewardship/financial programs. The Budget Section shall prepare and submit to the Association in its Annual Session an itemized proposed budget for the coming year. The Budget Section shall receive, evaluate and make recommendations concerning all requests for funds. The Accounting Section shall prepare and present to the Executive Committee quarterly finance reports and

annual reports to the Association in Annual Session. (For a full statement on all responsibilities of the Stewardship Committee, see the Stewardship Manual on file in the FBA Office).

The Chairman of the Stewardship Committee may serve as Interim Treasurer in the absence or incapacity of the Treasurer.

ARTICLE 11: COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS

The Committee of Nominations shall be composed of six persons with one person elected from each of the six Associational church groupings. Each person elected to the Committee on Nominations shall serve a three year term, with two rotating off each year.

The duty of the Committee on Nominations shall be to nominate at each Annual Session the following officers and committees, representatives, and such others as the Association may desire from time to time. Committee members shall serve on a three year rotation basis with one-third rotating off each year. All Associational officers and committees shall serve from the close of the Annual Session at which each was elected until the expiration of the term of service as specified in the By-laws for each office or committee.

ARTICLE 12: MISSIONS DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

The Missions Development Council (Composed of a Director, a Missions Survey Director, a Promotion Director, representatives from the Woman's Missionary Union, Men's Ministries, Sunday School, Discipleship Training, and such Component Program Directors ¹ as may be needed; shall organize and structure itself in order to accomplish its tasks. Our Associational Missions Development Council will assist the churches in accomplishing their mission by providing resources, services, training and promotion of opportunities to work together in missions, ministry, and evangelism.

ARTICLE 13: ASSOCIATIONAL COUNCIL

The Associational Council (composed of the Director of Missions, Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Sunday School Director, Discipleship Training Director, Men's Ministries Director, Woman's Missionary Union Director, Music Director, Family Ministry Director, Missions Development Council Director, Stewardship Committee Chairman) will serve to coordinate the work of the Association. The council will meet as often as necessary, but preferably, quarterly to coordinate programs and projects

The council will prepare an Associational Calendar of Activities and make suggestions and recommendations to the Association or Executive Committee on programs, services, and emphases. The Director of Missions will serve as Chairman. In the absence of the Director of Missions, the Moderator will serve as Interim Chairman.

The council shall receive applications from all churches desiring to affiliate with the Florence Baptist Association. The council will examine the faith and practice of the applicant. It will offer suggestions to the applying church and make proper recommendations to the Executive Committee and the Association in Annual Session. The condition of Article IV of the Constitution must be followed with exception being made to waive the one year waiting period for the admission of a newly constituted church which was formerly in fellowship with the Association as a church sponsored mission for at least one year.

ARTICLE 14: PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

The Personnel Committee shall be composed of six members on rotating terms with two being elected each year for a three year term. The Moderator will be an ex-officio member.

This committee shall prepare job descriptions for all staff members and recommend any revisions, as occasions warrant. It shall maintain the job descriptions, as approved by the Executive Committee, on file in the Association Office. The job descriptions shall be reviewed at least every five years. It shall interview and recommend for employment all staff members

and shall make recommendations each year to the Stewardship Committee, pertaining to salaries and benefits for staff members. The committee shall review any problem that might arise relating to the employed staff, making recommendations to the Executive Committee.

When the staff position of the Director of Missions is vacant, this committee will serve as the Search Committee.

ARTICLE 15: DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS: EMPLOYMENT

Upon recommendation by the Personnel Committee of a suitable candidate for the position, a prospective Director of Missions will be recommended for interview to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee will present to the Association the candidate for the position. A call for employment will be issued by at least a three/fourth vote of a called or regular session of the Association.

Dismissal of the Director of Missions may be done by the Executive Committee only after the following procedural steps:

- 1. A recommendation must be brought to the Executive Committee by the Personnel Committee.
- 2. The Moderator will notify all members of the Executive Committee by mail at least fifteen days prior to the called meeting to consider this recommendation.
- 3. A majority of churches must be represented at the called meeting.
- 4. In order to dismiss the Director of Missions, two-third vote of the members present and voting will be required.

ARTICLE 16: PROGRAM COMMITTEE

The Program Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Vice-Moderator and Clerk of the Association, and they shall plan and present the program, in printed form, for the sessions of the Association.

When adopted by the Association, at the annual session, this program shall become its order of business.

ARTICLE 17: VISITORS

Visitors may be invited to participate in the deliberations of the Association without the privilege to vote.

ARTICLE 18: TRUSTEES

The Association shall elect at least six members to serve as Trustees. Their term of office shall be for three years with one-third of the number elected each year. They shall assume their duties at the close of the session at which they are elected and shall serve until their successors are elected and assume their duties. Vacancies may be filled at any time by the Executive Committee, with the one elected filling out the unexpired term of the one whose vacancy is being filled. Persons completing three-year terms will not be eligible for re-election until after the lapse of one year.

ARTICLE 19: FAMILY MINISTRY COUNCIL

- 1. The Association shall elect annually a Family Ministry Council composed of a Director and coordinators for Youth, Single Adults and Senior Adults.
- 2. The task of the Family Ministry Council shall be to: 1) Train, develop, and encourage church and associational family ministry work; 2) Provide opportunities for working together in family ministry; 3) Provide family ministry resources and services to churches and leaders; 4) Nurture fellowship among senior adults and single adults; and, 5) Establish and maintain appropriate communications and relationships within the community and the denomination.

ARTICLE 20: AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a majority vote, provided the proposed change has been referred to the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws for clarification and correlation. All amendments shall become effective at the close of the meeting at which they were adopted. No resolution adopted by this association shall become a part of these By-Laws.

ARTICLE 21: EFFECTIVE DATE

These By-Laws shall become effective immediately upon passage and all By-Laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
