As I write this, on March 15th at 2:00 PM, it has been an eventful day. Just this morning I was able to represent you and fellow Southern Baptist as the Florence Long Term Recovery Group was recognized before the Florence County Council. Many of you that are reading this have given time, money, and other resources during the recent string of disasters. You have trained, cooked, cleaned, cut and dragged downed trees, patched, built, tore down and many other activities that are involved in disaster relief and rebuild. How many of you knew what "Shockwave" was before the flood? So I had the opportunity to represent each of you this morning as you have allowed me to serve Florence County and beyond in these disaster and rebuild efforts.

I left the meeting to check on progress at a house, in Florence, that SC Rebuild is putting a roof on. Young Men from The King's Academy are providing the labor as a part of the schools Missions Week. South Carolina Rebuild is funding the materials and Jack McCormick who heads up SC Rebuild is supervising the efforts along with Adult Teachers from TKA, a local pastor, myself, and even our State Disaster Relief Director Randy Creamer has worked a couple of days. Having made it to the office now, I

have contacted the Mother of the Amish young man that you have contributed, so generously, to pay for his medical transport back to Kentucky. He is making progress in rehab and I shared with her about your generosity that has led to more contributions to help the family.

Last week I spent two long days, at the North American Mission Board, in intensive training for church revitalization and replanting. I have some ideas that start with this year's January Bible Study which are on Revelation chapters 1-3. Before that comes around, I want you to start thinking about the Week of Prayer for Associational Missions. May 20-27 is the week designated but if that week doesn't fit your church calendar, you may choose another. Thanks for allowing me to serve the churches of the Florence Baptist Association. I love my job, all the churches, and each opportunity to partner in the Kingdom of God. Now I must go pack for Nicaragua. Pray for the mission team to Ohio April 2-8.
