Director of Missions Report

I came to the FBA in June of 2012. That means it has been seven years that we have been working together. I always find it difficult when looking back on the past year of my work. I could name the number of churches I had preached in and/or visited. I could tell you about how I have worked with churches finding new pastors and/or staff. Also, you could be told of how I have worked with churches and staff that have had problems. Those are the parts of my position that stays as confidential as it needs to. So, it means I have to tell you about other things that are more general.

During the fall preparation was being made with a group of pastors/staff for the January Bible Study. We had almost half of the FBA churches that participated. There were several clusters of churches and several that did it by themselves. We had successful study times at each venue and apart from a few things, that we learned needed to be different, everyone seemed to benefit from the study in Revelation.

Tracy and I attended the DOM Retreat in January of this year. Bill Elliff was the speaker which lead to ultimately hosting a conference with him last month. I also hold a leadership position with the State DOMs. The leadership team meets quarterly to continue working effectively with the SCBC. Starting this August, a DOM Cohort has been meeting monthly with Mac Lake, formerly with the NAMB. He has been coaching us through processes of change that are happening among our churches and renewed purpose in our work among Associations.

We continue to explore partnerships and we currently have a relationship with a ministry in Nicaragua. Also, there is a trip scheduled for later this month to help East Baptist Church in Charlotte. Disaster Relief is a partnership of sorts and a ministry that we have had many of our churches and volunteers involved in. During the past year we have added a large pole barn and storage building behind the office. While we have ended rebuild in the state, we did have churches involved this past year in the rebuild efforts. We continue to be the regional hub for Disaster Relief and rebuild efforts.

As everything continues to change rapidly in our families, congregations, and denominational life, the FBA needs to be active in response to these changes. If you read the newsletter you have heard about the upcoming reset. I will address that in an oral report at the end of the Annual Meeting. I appreciate the opportunity to work with the 41 churches of the FBA. It is very different now than seven years ago when I came. We have no need to fear as God is ultimately in control. We need to be good stewards of the resources and time he has entrusted to us. I intend to continue to lead as a good steward.

Mission and Ministries Development Director Report

In December 2018 our association prepared 927 prisoner packets in partnership with the SC Baptist Convention. The majority of our churches participated in the Operation Christmas Child shoebox ministry collecting 5,067 boxes from our FBA churches. Calvary served as the OCC Collection Center for the fourth year. In August 2018 our churches collected 953 "Back to School" packets for the students at Francis Marion. We also collected hygiene items for the health room at South Florence High School and other FSD1 schools. Our first collection for the Crayon Initiative netted 344 pounds of crayons that will be recycled for pediatric wards. Over 800 new and gently used books were collected for Connie Maxwell Children's Home reading program. We had so many that some were shared with a teacher in Marion County for the children in her school. In June we partnered with the Florence YMCA in their MEP (Migratory Education Program - math and ELA) and collected enough money for me to purchase 67 bilingual books for their Parent's Night program. In remembrance of the shooting on October 3, 2018 we collected enough funds to purchase 62 tourniquets for our local law enforcement officers. Toni Brandt, a police officers' wife, lead in this effort and total of 325 were donated by our community. Love Packages is a ministry that sends old Sunday School material, Bibles and other Christian material to English speaking third world countries. We collected material October 2018, March 2019, July 8, 2019; and October 2, 2019. Thanks to everyone who participated in any of these ministries.

Hannah Means and Faith Haynes served as our student missionaries this summer. They worked at the YMCA on Wednesday and Thursday doing the devotion time for the children. God blessed us with two salvations as a result of their ministry there. We had a great week of ministry with LifeChangers, June 16-21. Calvary Baptist graciously hosted us again for our 17th year. There were about 98 youth and adult participants from 7 churches involved in the week of work. We had 6 crews that worked on 6 homes in the community. We had one roof job and numerous paint jobs with most involving replacing rotten wood. Rev. Adam Pfahlert, Pastor at Union Baptist Church, was our camp pastor for the week. Rev. Landon Reynolds and the praise band from Calvary led in worship. Praise God we had one salvation during LifeChangers. Lunches and the evening meals were prepared by FBA churches.

In September 2019, the Christian Learning Center began the 17th year of ministry. Currently there are 3 classes at Southside, 4 at Sneed, 2 at Hannah Pamplico, and 3 classes at Williams Middle for a total of 12 classes. All of our classes are now just 9 weeks classes, so the curriculum has been written to fit that time frame and all of FSD1 classes are going by the same curriculum. God continues to bless the ministry of CEF through the Good News Clubs. Currently there are 15 Good News Clubs in FSD1, one in FSD2 (Pamplico), one in FSD3 (Olanta), and 6 GNC in Darlington Co Schools. During the 2018-19 school year, 1502 children were enrolled in Good News Club and there were 95 salvations! Praise the Lord. Several FBA churches participated in the RedWolves Faith and Family night on Monday, June 24th. A total of 105 tickets were sold through the FBA.

Our fifth annual BLISS Ball was held on October 5, 2019 at Calvary Baptist Church. The BLISS Ball is a prom event for children and adults with special needs. Children through age 15 were our guests from 3 pm – 5 pm and then age 16 through adults were our guests from 6 pm – 8 pm. Twenty-nine guests registered for the younger ball and 77 registered for the older ball. The theme for the event was "Winter Wonderland." There was a photo booth and a professional photographer to take portraits, as well as plenty of food, dancing and a devotion time. Each guest received a treat box as they left. Thanks to all the volunteers who provided food, helped make decorations and centerpieces for the tables, or volunteered to help the day of the event. It

was an awesome experience and was appreciated so much by the parents and caregivers of our guests!

The Eastern Carolina Agricultural Fair was held October 8-13. A chicken bog meal for the fair workers was served Monday Oct. 7 at 5:30 pm. On Wednesday, October 9 we did FREE blood pressure checks, haircuts, children's ministry, photographs, and doughnuts and drinks from 9:30 am – 12:30 pm. Friday, October 11 Leo Carter lead in a bi-lingual devotion time while the workers enjoyed a biscuit. The devotion was followed by the FREE Yard sale from 10 am until 11 am. Each person was given 10 tickets to spend at the sale. After the fair closed October 13 we gave out 200 Snack Sacks to the workers as they were breaking down and packing up to move on to the next town. A HUGE THANKS to all of the volunteers who have contributed to the fair ministry in so many ways.

It is my honor to serve as your missionary. Thanks for all of your support.

The 2019-2020 school year has started and we are grateful for what God has already done through the ministry of BCM at Florence Darlington Technical College and Francis Marion University.

Over the summer, BCM students served on mission in the Netherlands, North Africa, Canada, and Texas.

Prior to classes starting, BCM had the opportunity to feed 90 student athletes and coaches, many being international students.

Thanks to many churches in the Florence Baptist Association we received over 900 welcome packs to give students at Francis Marion University. During the first week of classes BCM distributed these welcome packs to athletes, new students, and returning students. BCM held an on campus cookout and a carnival at the BCM building. In total, BCM served 700 students through these events.

Throughout the semester we have averaged 100 college students on our Tuesday night gatherings. We are grateful for the partnership in ministry from many churches as they provide meals for students prior to our worship gatherings each week. We have seen 2 students accept Christ already this semester.

There are 7 student-led Bible Studies that meet weekly on campus and 75 students are actively involved in theses discipleship groups.

Thank you to our churches who have supported us, provided welcome packs, served dinner, and assisted in our events throughout this semester. The ministry at BCM would not be possible without your support.

Charleston Southern University recognizes the important "partnership in the gospel" shared with the churches of the South Carolina Baptist Convention (Philippians 1:5, HCSB). Our vision statement articulates our role in this partnership: to be a Christian university nationally recognized for integrating faith in learning, leading and serving. It was certainly a Christ-filled year of opportunities and celebrations with the inauguration of CSU's third president, Dr. Dondi Costin, in October 2018. Our physician assistant graduate program has 55 students enrolled with a 100% retention rate. Discipline-specific accreditation for academic programs remains a priority, and we began graduate programs in clinical counseling, biology, and supply chain management. For 10 years, the NCLEX pass rate for our College of Nursing graduates continues to be the highest in South Carolina, and *U.S. News & World Report* ranked our online undergraduate program as the best in South Carolina. **770** students graduated in May 2019, our largest graduating class in CSU history!

North Greenville University

2019 marks the 70th anniversary of North Greenville University entering into a covenantal relationship with the South Carolina Baptist Convention. In 1949, the SCBC assumed control of and offered support to the institution, replacing the SBC's Home Mission Board as the sponsoring entity. NGU has maintained strong relationships with local churches, associations, and other entities as it has sought to offer Kingdom support to their Gospel-centric work. Our university leaders, including our full-time Christian Studies professors, all affirm without reservation the Baptist Faith & Message 2000 and seek to cultivate an understanding of it by our entire community. Our faculty development program has recently included both evangelism training and an overview of the Baptist Faith & Message 2000, so that our foundational convictions are clear. We continue to hold a campus revival, "Ignite," to open our year's sessions, we hold a Global Missions Conference in the fall semester, and we have a Worldview Week that allows students to consider important issues from a biblically faithful perspective. We consecrate our new academic year each fall with a public reading of the Bible, from Genesis to Revelation.

To ensure that our mission is strong in academics, student life, and campus ministries, we have merged the latter two divisions under a single vice president, Jody Jennings, who will ensure that they continue to function with a unified dedication to our Christ-first mission. We have appointed long-time leader Steve Crouse, to serve as the university's Chief Spiritual Formation Officer, one of the only ones in the nation, cultivating this important activity across the university's divisions. These two leaders join our provost, Nathan Finn, as the "Learning Communities Team," overseeing the alignment of these primary functions of the university. To communicate our clear dedication to the importance of the sanctity of life, this year we awarded two honorary doctorates, recognizing the long service of Lenna Fox Smith, the now-retired CEO of the Piedmont Women's Center, and Alexia Newman, the CEO of the Carolina Pregnancy Center. These leaders have anchored the Upstate response to crisis pregnancies

and family issues that allow the love of Christ to be manifest to those in need. We have represented NGU and South Carolina Baptists with our SBC national leaders, including chapel speakers from Southeastern Seminary (Chuck Lawless, Walter Strickland), Southern Seminary (Matthew Hall), Midwestern Seminary (John Mark Yeats), Southwestern Seminary (Evan Lenow), and the ERLC (Russell Moore). In March 2019 we also hosted the Southeast Regional meeting of the Evangelical Theological Society. This year we will welcome the new presidents at Lifeway (Ben Mandrell), Southwestern Seminary (Adam Greenway), and New Orleans Seminary (Jamie Dew). We continue to offer special scholarships to dependents of International Mission Board personnel and other SBC servants. We also continue to host Lifeway's Fuge camps; this past summer these camps saw 217 professions of faith, 484 recommitments, and 43 commitments to Christian vocations!

Our students are deeply committed to missions and service. Over 300 undergraduate students (about 15% of undergraduate enrollment) participated in summer missions, church work, or faith-related internships. Our mission teams (Joyful Sound, Campus Band, Act II, and other groups) served local churches with music, dramatic productions, and youth discipleship. Our professional education division offered workshops on church safety, non-profit legal updates, and other important functions. Our faculty and staff continue to offer pulpit supply, interim service, and other specialized service to churches and associations.

In academics, we have streamlined our major divisions from seventeen to six, consolidating administrative assignments for efficiency and effectiveness, even as we have added new programs. Our new Institute for Global Leadership (under the direction of Allen McWhite) will provide students with opportunities for more overseas study and service programs, along with more curricular options. Our graduate Physician's Assistant program had about 800 applicants for 30 slots. It is expected that our fall enrollment (not available at the time of this report) will be strong, especially with those programs based at the Tim Brashier Campus in Greer.

Our athletics programs provide opportunities for many students and are recognized for their strong connection to our mission. We have a full-time Fellowship of Christian Athletes director and several teams have pastoral chaplains. Conference Carolinas recognized our programs with their inaugural "Mind-Body-Soul" award, affirming our commitment to educating the whole student-athlete (1 Thes.5:13). Baseball and distance track both enjoyed #1 rankings in the nation this year and had multiple athletes named as All-Americans.

Finally, the university remains very healthy financially. We continue to have no bank-issued debt, allowing our tuition to be well below average and our students to complete their degrees with less student loan debt on average than most public universities in the state. Our revenues have grown by approximately 11% over the past three years and giving is strong, increasing by nearly 70% over the past three years. Philanthropist and evangelist T. Walter Brashier allocated an earlier \$3MM gift to aid ministerial students and dependents of ministers through a new endowed scholarship fund. That support was bolstered by nearly \$2MM in new gifts to NGU from Dr. Brashier since 2017. We continue to enhance our campus through various projects. This year we have completed the renovation of another residence hall, created a new Information Technology Services Center, and have constructed a new baseball stadium, the George Bomar Family Stadium.

We are grateful for the support, accountability, and prayers of the South Carolina Baptist Convention and look forward to our 71st year as a convention agency!

For almost 70 years, the Baptist Foundation of South Carolina has experienced the great faithfulness of God through the faithfulness of His people. Every day, we encounter faithful servants who express their faith in God through stewardship of His blessings during their lifetimes and beyond.

The phrase in the song, "all I have needed Thy hand hath provided, 'Great is Thy faithfulness,' Lord unto me" sums it up. God provides all that we need and more. God is good and He is faithful to His promises!

The Baptist Foundation exists to share the message that a faithful God blesses us in order to fulfill Kingdom work. As Christians, our greatest goal and our greatest joy is to give God glory. We live in a generation in which Christians have accumulated more lifetime blessings than in any time in history. Our generation has the capacity and means to take the Gospel message to every corner of our world! We believe, that God is calling us to partner with Him in doing just that!

Through financial and giving services, we help God's people realize that He has given us the resources wisely steward His blessings throughout our lifetimes and beyond. We want that message permeated throughout every church in South Carolina.

Major accomplishments of the Baptist Foundation this year include:

- Completed a major conversion to transition accounting of over 1,100 individual trust, endowment, and church investment accounts to an in-house system. Results include more timely and accurate transaction processing and reporting, more appealing client statements, and more personalized service.
- Worked with numerous churches and partners to help them define the purposes for the dollars God has entrusted them with in order to make sound decisions about investment of *God's money given by God's people for God's purposes*.
- Hired a Church Relations Representative to focus on church partnerships in the upstate.
- Enhanced our messaging and communications so that we can more effectively partner with South Carolina people and ministries to fund Great Commission ministry needs.
- Renewed a church legacy ministry strategy that will help churches provide an ongoing legacy emphasis that will focus on a culture of Kingdom generosity.
- Through Christian estate planning services, the Foundation provides customized estate planning for families/individuals who desire to leave a portion of their estates to Kingdom ministries. To date, **260 families** have completed estate plans with anticipated future gifts of **over \$70 million** for primarily Baptist ministries.

- Distributed **over \$3 million** to primarily Baptist ministries as of fiscal year end (3/31/2019) through endowment and investment income, the sixth consecutive year of distributions over \$3 million. Since inception, the Foundation has distributed over **\$80 million** to Kingdom ministries, from churches in South Carolina to missions projects around the world.
- Continued to tithe the Foundation's own resources to provide grants to help fund evangelistic projects.
- In 2018, grants totaling **\$82,000** were awarded. Since the program began in 2002, the Foundation's tithe and endowed gifts for grants have resulted in over **\$1,000,000** in ministry grants.
- Managed nearly **\$140 million** in assets for the benefit of churches, associations, and Baptist institutions across our state, nation, and the world.

The Foundation's future is focused on developing a purposeful strategy to help more of our churches engage in a Great Commission funding mindset using resources today and tomorrow. We want to come alongside pastors and laypeople across our state to help them foster and encourage a culture of generosity in their churches as we work together to support the church of the future and to fulfill the Great Commission.

God's faithfulness to His people is great! Our prayer is that every South Carolina Baptist will be resolute and urgent in their personal stewardship and legacy planning as they prayerfully contemplate the impact that their stewardship of His blessings can have in the fulfillment of HIS Great Commission!

2019 Connie Maxwell Children's Home

- In September 2018, Connie Maxwell embarked upon the creation of the "Connie Maxwell Children's Home: A Plan for the Future." This comprehensive, strategic planning effort encompassed the organization of five committees with over 50 alumni, staff, and community leaders to architect a future vision for the next ten years. The overall results, after four months of committee meetings, was presented in December 2018. These committees included: Church, Advancement, Services/Programs, Marketing/Communications and Business/Personnel.
- In the Spring of 2019, a "Call to Conversation" Tour presented a draft of this plan to over twenty different constituency groups including: prospects and donors, Alumni Board, past Board of Trustee members, Rotary Clubs, churches and staff. The plan was also prominently featured on Connie Maxwell's website to promote transparency, encourage conversation, and solicit feedback.
- "The Connie Maxwell Children's Home: A Plan for the Future" was unanimously approved by the Board of Trustees in May 2019. Within two weeks of the approval, the Executive Council held a two day retreat to begin planning and implementation. It was decided, after review of the internal and external preparation needed, that we were not ready to launch our plan until October 2020. The official start date will be October 2020 and run through October 2030. There were two strategic priorities that emerged: Unity and a "Deeper Dive" into Healing. This timeframe will include the development of a comprehensive campaign to fund future projects, strengthen unrestricted operational funds, and build the strength of the endowment.
- As a strategic priority of our future plan, a Vice President of Human Resources was hired in July 2019 and the development of this critical area has begun. Additionally, an Intake Coordinator was hired to intensify our recruitment efforts, increase population, and strengthen ministry opportunities.

- A "Branding Initiative" is in the process of being implemented to renew, refresh, and make relevant Connie Maxwell's identity in South Carolina and beyond.
- Connie Maxwell provided services for 395 children and families in residential care this year at Greenwood, Cooper Nixon, Orangeburg, Mauldin, Florence, and Chesterfield campuses.
- Family Care provided services to 14 families which consisted of 41 single parents and their children.
- Foster Care services has 19 homes licensed and has served 20 children this past year. Currently, we are working with SCBC, WMU, and the Duke Endowment to create a partnership to strengthen Foster Care's exposure, marketing, recruitment, and overall scope of impact across South Carolina.
- Connie Maxwell Higher Education/Independent Living program served 11 children this year.
- This summer, over 60 Connie Maxwell children attended faith-based camps, including RA and GA Camps, Camp Voyager, Garden City Beach, Folly Beach, Vacation Bible Schools, IMPACT, and the Warriors Group.
- A \$575,000 legacy gift was received from a longtime supporter and friend of Connie Maxwell's ministry.
- •2,845 Volunteers provided 13,681 hours of service to Connie Maxwell. That translates to more than \$337,000 in benefits to our tender ministry. Stahn Cottage at the Greenwood campus was completely renovated and updated for optimal use.
- The 20th Annual Connie Maxwell Christmas brought over 10,000 visitors in two nights to celebrate the birth of Jesus.
- Connie Maxwell Baptist Church baptized 6 children.
