Missionaries learn culture and learn to adapt to culture to effectively share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. A friend of mine serving as a church planter out west, planned a cookout as an outreach for Good Friday. One of his team with a Catholic heritage told him that even though they didn't attend mass, the majority of those also with a Catholic heritage, would not think of eating meat, other than fish, on Good Friday. With a little understanding of culture, the cook out turned into a fish fry and was much more successful!

Even though we are most like those in our congregations, we should not be like those in the majority culture. If we are going to reach our communities for Christ, we need to think and act like missionaries. Paul said it like this: "I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some." I Corinthians 9:22b

Provide an evening meal for the group at your church. (Tuesday, Thursday, Friday nights needed.)




