Return Service Requested

There has been much news surrounding the Southern Baptist Convention which met earlier this month. I had determined some time ago that I would not attend this year's convention even though I usually do. Being in California made the trip far more expensive than Nashville last year and New Orleans next year. I did watch portions of the meeting online. The "hot button" issues were the report of the investigation into sexual abuse which was released some time prior to the meeting in Anaheim. Steps are being implemented to assure there will be no future coverup of sexual abuse by any Baptist entities. This particular issue has raised issues of transparency among our SBC entities. Financial transparency is important as some called for a forensic audit of the North American Mission Board.

Women in ministry continues to be a concern for many in the convention. The Baptist Faith and Message is clear that a woman not serve as a senior/lead pastor. Some churches that have women serving as pastors, that preach/teach but are not in authority, consider themselves in agreement with the Baptist Faith and Message. Ordination of women is also a concern for many. We unlike most denominations have a confession of faith which is our standard. There is no one telling any one church what they must do unless they are out of the boundaries of our confession, the BF&M.

Many years ago, the Southern Baptist Convention grew out of a need for working together in our missionary endeavors and educating our pastors.

This has grown to include many other ministries that we do together. Here in SC, we have Children's Homes, Retirement/nursing/rehab facilities, universities and other ministries. We have had as a guide the BF&M 1925, 1963, and 2000. This allows churches autonomy and the ability to practice ministry differently but within the confines of our current 2000 BF&M. In our own Florence Baptist Association, we have churches that allow women to serve in various roles including Deacon. We have others that would not have a Sunday school class of adults, taught by a woman. Most congregations are somewhere between in their practices.

We have the opportunity to continue to support missionaries, church planters and replants, our colleges and seminaries, children's homes, retirement communities and other ministries, while continuing to be an autonomous body. If your beliefs as a congregation go too far in one direction you have the opportunity to disassociate unlike the fight that continues among United Methodist Churches. We aren't perfect, but we are better than most. Strive to be the congregation/local church God intends for you to be.
