## **Director of Missions Report**

I have now served you for over ten years. It seems much shorter until I look back at all that has transpired in those ten years. Rather than report chronologically about the past year, I will simply mention trends and highlights. Let me begin with recent highlights. The Senior Adult rally was great! We celebrate currently every church has a pastor. I can remember when I first came, I believe there were five churches looking for pastors. That number fluctuated but this is the first time we have every church filled. Now let's address the other side of that. Churches that are looking for pastors and staff are seeing the number of resumes they receive has dramatically decreased. It was not unusual for a church to receive more than one hundred resumes for the position of pastor. Current numbers are now more like 20-30.

So, with resumes for pastors decreasing, what do you think happens when you are looking for a part-time or bi-vocational position? You are correct, the pool is even smaller. We are moving away from the model where we simply advertise and "hire" a staff person to looking for those spiritual gifts within the congregation. About 20 years ago, a larger church in Northeast Columbia, began to move away from hiring fulltime staff positions to multiple part-time positions. Most of those people were from within the church.

Back in the 1970's, where my father was pastor, the music director position was filled by people from within the church. It came as a result of identifying talent and gifts along with some training. Our music director was leaving the area, but he was mentoring his replacement. The replacement was talented and served well. My home church has continued to fill this position from within. Have you looked for anyone to play the organ lately? Piano players are not as easy to find as they used to be.

As I am in the last year of my 50's and on the youngest end of the "Baby Boomer Generation", I am concerned for my children. Some of us have learned to use "facetime" so we can see grandchildren. We might even be able to Venmo them some money. To think that we would make changes to be able to see and help the ones we love and have a different attitude entirely when it comes to the church. There is a prevailing attitude among some openly, and others privately, "I hope things stay the same in the church until I am gone, and then I don't care what they do".

Over the last twenty years our culture and the church have changed drastically. Numbers attending church are dropping. This includes those inside and outside the church. Some left with Covid and have no intention of returning. This past year Oakdale church disband. Before you gasp, realize that "God causes everything to work together for good for those called according to His purpose.....". The pastor of Oakdale, Steece Hayes and the pastor of Hoffmeyer Road, Greg Batchelor became friends. As they talked and prayed through the dilemma, God began to unveil a plan. Long story short, Hoffmeyer launched a new campus there and have seen multiple baptisms in a few short weeks.

In Coward, Ariel Baptist has seen new life and has had baptisms for the first time in years. Many of you may have heard Unity Baptist has sold their building to a Christian school. Since the size of the congregation no longer matched the large facility, they saw another opportunity to use

the buildings for the Glory of God. Someone said "it would be better for hundreds of kids to hear about Jesus all week than for just a few of us on Sunday". Pray for them as they continue to meet and contemplate the future.

Our concern must be for the proclamation of the Gospel and the Kingdom of God here on earth. We must be relevant to the lost. As I continue to serve you, I continue to learn. We are here to help, encourage, and serve you. We don't have any magic formulas to meet needs. Perhaps our greatest need is to do what Jesus said in Matthew 9: "pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest".

# Mission and Ministries Development Director

In December 2021 our association prepared 909 prisoner packets in partnership with the SC Baptist Convention. Several volunteers from the FBA went to Shandon on December 6 to help check all the prisoner packets that came into SCBC. The majority of our churches participated in the Operation Christmas Child 2020 shoebox ministry collecting 6953 boxes from our FBA churches. The FBA adopted the girls at Connie Maxwell, Pee Dee Campus for Christmas. Different individuals and churches purchased the items on their Christmas Wish Lists. We also collected hygiene items for the health room at South Florence High School and other FSD1 schools. Love Packages is a ministry that sends old Sunday School material, Bibles and other Christian material to English speaking third world countries. We collected material twice during the year (April and September) and took them to Mt. Sinai Baptist Church in Shelby NC where they palatize the material and send it on to Love Packages warehouse in Decatur AL.

We had a great week of ministry with LifeChangers, June 19-24, 2021. Calvary Baptist graciously hosted us again for our 19<sup>th</sup> year. There were 62 youth and adult participants from 4 churches which made up 4 crews that worked on 5 homes during the week. Rev. Blake Godbold, Pastor of Mizpah Baptist Church, was our camp pastor for the week. Thanks to the churches who provided lunches for the crews at the work site and to those who hosted us for supper.

In August 2022 our churches collected 1043 "Back to School" packets for the students at Francis Marion. BCM used them to welcome the students to campus and invite them to their BCM events. The Christian Learning Center (CLC) began their 19th year of ministry in August 2022. CLC was excited to restart 2 classes with Southside Middle School meeting at a new site – South Florence Baptist Church. This semester there are 2 classes with Sneed students that meets at Ebenezer Baptist, 2 classes with Williams students meeting at New Life Church of our Lord Jesus Christ, 3 with Moore students meeting at Hoffmeyer Road, 3 with Hannah Pamplico students meeting at Mt. Zion Baptist for a total of 12 classes. Good News Clubs happened on a limited basis and in restricted ways because of the remnants of covid. The YMCA was open to a club so a team was sent there. Total for the 2021-22 school year was 20 clubs (14 locations) with 119 salvations! The CYIA summer missionaries with CEF did Five Day clubs in 11 locations, had 456 children attend and 14 salvations. Praise the Lord for these salvations. More schools are opening back up to having Good News Club so we are looking forward to a super fruitful year.

Our seventh annual BLISS Ball was held on October 1, 2022 at Calvary Baptist Church. The BLISS Ball is a prom event for children and adults with special needs. Children through age 15 were our guests from 3 pm - 5 pm and age 16 through adults were our guests from 6 pm - 8 pm. Twenty guests registered for the younger ball and 90 registered for the older ball. Of course, not all of them actually came but we are encouraged that attendance is increasing. The theme for the event was "Dr. Seuss" There was a photo booth and a professional photographer to take portraits, as well as plenty of food, dancing and a devotion time. Each guest received a treat bag as they left. It was an awesome experience and was appreciated so much by the parents and caregivers of our guests! Check out the pictures of the evening on the BLISS Ball Facebook page.

The Eastern Carolina Agricultural Fair will be held October 27-November 5th. A chicken bog meal for the fair workers will be Wednesday, October 26 at 5:30 pm. Ministry health kits will be given to the workers as they pick up their meals. On Wednesday, November 2 we will do FREE blood pressure checks, haircuts, photographs, and doughnuts and coffee from 10 am–12 pm. Friday, November 4 we will serve the workers breakfast and have a devotion followed by a

FREE Yard sale. After the fair closes November 5, we will give out 200 Snack Sacks to the workers as they are breaking down and packing up to move on to the next town. A HUGE THANKS to all of the volunteers who will contribute to the fair ministry in so many ways.

It is my honor to serve as your missionary. Thanks for all of your support because without you this ministry would be impossible.

#### Constitution

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this body is "The Florence Baptist Association."

ARTICLE II: (MISSION and) PURPOSE

Mission Statement: The Florence Baptist Association is a network of churches cooperating to make disciples and advance the gospel for the glory of God.

It is the purpose of the Association to: 1. provide an organization of cooperation for the Southern Baptist Churches, 2. to encourage said churches to faithfulness in every endeavor which we shall undertake in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. 3. to support the Cooperative Program of the South Carolina Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.

#### ARTICLE III: VOTING MEMBERS FOR ANNUAL MEETING

The association membership shall consist only of duly elected messengers who are members of the affiliated churches. Membership shall be comprised of the following:

- (1) Three messengers from each church and one additional messenger for each fifty members or fraction thereof, up to a maximum of twelve messengers.
- (2) The pastors of the affiliated churches.
- (3) The duly elected officers of the association.
- (4) The members of the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE IV: AFFILIATED PROCEDURES

Those Southern Baptist Churches which have petitioned for membership and which by vote of the Association are accounted to be in fellowship with the purpose and undertaking of this body shall comprise the list of affiliated churches. The vote of the association to extend fellowship, or to withdraw fellowship, shall be a two-thirds vote by messengers present and voting.

All churches of like faith and order may be admitted as members into this Association by twothirds vote of the messengers present and voting, provided that the applying churches comply with Article 9 of the By-laws of this Constitution, and make known their desire to become members of the Association to the executive committee no less than six months-prior to) the annual meeting when the Association will take action on their request.

- 1. The Association shall regard the churches as autonomous bodies in all their internal affairs and exercise no ecclesiastical jurisdiction or claim any legislative or judicial power over them.
- 2. As every church is an autonomous body, amenable as far as authority is concerned to the Great Head of the Church alone, any church shall have full power to terminate its connection with the Association whenever it may see fit. While, however, a church chooses to continue this

connection, the Association must have relative right to inquire into its standing whenever it may be necessary to do so, and in case of dissatisfaction to withdraw from it.

#### ARTICLE V: OFFICERS

The officers of this Association shall be elected at the annual meeting and shall assume their duties at the close of the meeting at which they are elected and serve until their successors are elected and assume their duties. Officers shall be: Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer. The term of Moderator and Vice Moderator shall be limited to three consecutive years. The clerk and treasurer may serve an indefinite term.

#### ARTICLE VI: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall consist of the leadership team, treasurer, all trustees together with a pastor and lay person from each church, and the Director of Missions as an ex-officio member.

The Executive Committee shall act for the Association ad interim in all matters not otherwise provided for and submit a full report of the work or activities to the Association at each annual meeting of the Association, together with plans and recommendations for the promotion and extension of the work. Any vacancy of whatever nature occurring between sessions of the association may be filled by the Executive Committee.

#### ARTICLE VII: TRUSTEES

The Trustees, or their successors in office, shall as provided by law and the action of the Association, hold in trust the title to all property of the Association, and shall represent the Association in all matters of legal responsibility regarding the purchase, improvement, and disposal of Associational property. They shall executive all legal papers relating to the Association as the Association may direct. They shall have no power to buy, sell, mortgage, lease or transfer any property of the Association without a specific vote of the Association authorizing such action; neither shall they have any control over the use of the Associational (real) property except by vote of the Association (Refer to Article 11 of the By-Laws).

#### ARTICLE VIII: ASSOCIATIONAL LEADERSHIP TEAM

The Associational Leadership Team shall be composed of the Director of Missions, the Community Missionary, and two members from each of the six church clusters. Each church cluster will ideally have a clergy and lay representative. The Moderator and Vice-Moderator will be included in the twelve. These will be nominated to the Leadership Team by the pastors of the cluster churches.

The Director of Missions will serve as Chairman. The Leadership Team's function is described in the By-Laws.

#### ARTICLE IX: PROCEDURE

The business of the Association will be conducted according to Roberts Rules of Order latest revised edition.

#### ARTICLE X: AMENDMENT

This Constitution may be amended at any meeting of the Association, Annual or Executive, by a two-thirds vote, provided that the proposed amendments have been read to the Association at a previous meeting and referred to the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws for clarification and correlation.

#### ARTICLE XI: ADOPTION

This Constitution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption, and any regulations in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

#### **BY-LAWS**

#### **ARTICLE 1: MEETINGS**

The Inspirational Meeting of the Association shall meet annually. These meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be decided by the Association(al Leadership Team) and messengers present at the annual meeting shall be considered a quorum. Special or called meetings may be held by a majority vote of the Executive Committee of the Association.

#### **ARTICLE 2: OPENING**

Meetings of the Executive Committee shall include a devotion and prayer.

#### ARTICLE 3: ORDER OF BUSINESS

An order of business shall be provided at the beginning of each meeting and shall be changed only by a two-thirds vote.

#### ARTICLE 4: ANNUAL CHURCH PROFILE

Each affiliated church shall ten days prior to the annual meeting submit to the clerk, on forms furnished by the clerk, a full report of the church work for the year ending August 31.

#### ARTICLE 5: MODERATOR AND VICE-MODERATOR

The Moderator or Vice-Moderator shall preside at all meetings of the Association. As opportunity may permit, they shall be representatives of the entire Association.

#### ARTICLE 6: CLERK

The Clerk shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association and shall prepare and provide minutes and statistics of the Association as soon as feasible after adjournment of the associational meeting.

#### **ARTICLE 7: FINANCES**

The administrative assistant shall receive all funds of the Association and disburse them according to the budget. A written report shall be provided for the annual session of the association, and meetings of the executive board and leadership team. Other reports will be provided as requested. The Treasurer will sign checks and have oversite of this process.

#### ARTICLE 8: COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

It shall be the duty of this committee to receive, examine, correlate, and make recommendations to the Executive Committee or the Association on all proposed amendments to the Constitution or By-Laws.

## ARTICLE 9: LEADERSHIP TEAM)

The Leadership Team shall be composed of the Director of Missions, Community Missionary, and a Clergy member and Layperson from each of the six church clusters. The twelve members will include the Moderator and Vice-Moderator. The Leadership Team will serve to coordinate the work of the Association and will meet as often as necessary.

The Leadership Team will prepare an Associational Calendar of Activities and make suggestions and recommendations to the Association or Executive Committee on programs, services, and emphases. They shall plan and present the program, in printed form, for the sessions of the Association. The Director of Missions will serve as Chairman. In the absence of the Director of Missions, the Moderator will serve as Interim Chairman.

The Leadership Team shall receive applications from churches desiring to affiliate with the Florence Baptist Association. The Leadership Team will examine the faith and practice of the applicant. It will offer suggestions to the applying church and make proper recommendations to the Executive Committee and the Association in Annual Meeting. The condition of Article IV of the Constitution must be followed with exception being made to waive the six month waiting period for the admission of a newly constituted church which was formerly in fellowship with the Association as a church sponsored mission for at least one year.

The Leadership Team will assume responsibilities previously associated with the Personnel, Stewardship, and Nominating Committees.

They shall prepare and revise job descriptions for all staff members and recommend any revisions, as occasions warrant. It shall maintain the job descriptions, as approved by the Executive Committee, on file in the Association Office. The job descriptions shall be reviewed at least every five years. It shall interview and recommend for employment all staff members and shall make recommendations each year pertaining to salaries and benefits for staff members. They shall review any problem that might arise relating to the employed staff, making recommendations to the Executive Committee.

When the staff position of the Director of Missions is vacant, members of this team will serve as the Search Committee.

The Leadership Team shall prepare and submit to the Association in its Annual Meeting an itemized proposed budget for the coming year. They shall receive, evaluate and make recommendations concerning all requests for funds.

#### ARTICLE 10: DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS: EMPLOYMENT

Upon recommendation by the Leadership Team of a suitable candidate for the position, a prospective Director of Missions will be recommended for interview to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee will present to the Association the candidate for the position. A call for employment will require at least a three/fourth vote of a called or regular session of the Association.

Dismissal of the Director of Missions may be done by the Executive Committee only after the following procedural steps:

- 1. A recommendation must be brought to the Executive Committee by the Leadership Team.
- 2. The Moderator will notify all members of the Executive Committee at least fifteen days prior to the called meeting to consider this recommendation.
- 3. A majority of churches must be represented at the called meeting.
- 4. In order to dismiss the Director of Missions, two-third vote of the members present and voting will be required.

#### **ARTICLE 11: TRUSTEES**

The Association shall elect at least six members to serve as Trustees. Their term of office shall be for three years with one-third of the number elected each year. They shall assume their duties at the close of the meeting at which they are elected and shall serve until their successors are elected and assume their duties. Vacancies may be filled at any time by the Executive Committee, with the one elected filling out the unexpired term of the one whose vacancy is being filled. Persons completing three-year terms will not be eligible for re-election until after the lapse of one year.

#### **ARTICLE 12: AMENDMENTS**

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular or called meeting of the Association by a majority vote, provided the proposed change has been referred to the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws for clarification and correlation. All amendments shall become effective at the close of the meeting at which they were adopted.

#### ARTICLE (13): EFFECTIVE DATE

These By-Laws shall become effective immediately upon passage.
